With the government provision of Skills Future Credits and National Silver Academy (NSA) grants; attending such formal lessons now becomes affordable. However, such courses are usually conducted in shopping centres. So, we broached the idea of conducting the courses in our church classroom where we can learn together in familiar and convenient premises. Thankfully, our church not only endorsed the idea but readily makes available the classroom for us to upgrade Seniors' digital skills.

We were also fortunate to find such a training agency – Xiohoo Pte Ltd, who was able to conduct lessons beyond their training facility. Thus, we were able to kick off the course on the basic function of mobile photography and digital photo editing on 16 and 23 April 2024, respectively.

Feedback from the sixteen Seniors who attended these two lessons thought that the camera functions were simple but realised there are more than meet the eye. They could use the camera to have burst shots and panorama pictures and learn when to take such shots. Also, for digital photo editing, they learn to download software to help them in photo editing using such functions as contrast, brightness, highlight, shadow, etc.

Also the participants felt that the trainer was engaging and patient. They look forward to his next lessons on 4 and 11 June on videography and video editing respectively.
